NORTHUMBERLAND

From the York site at Naburn Lock we drove to Border Forest Park, Cottonshopeburnfoot, Otterburn NE19 1TF and close to the A68.

Border Forest Park is a secluded, family run park located in the centre of Northumberland's National Park. Direct access over Border Forest Bridge drops you into the mighty Kielder Forest.

The Pennine Way runs parallel with the lower part of The Park where walks are abundant with the surrounding forest, ideal for dog walking, mountain biking, pony trekking and nature watching are all nearby.

The Park has excellent access and can accommodate motorhomes, touring caravans and tents. A level site ensure that disability access is excellent.

The site has modern shower facilities (all included) and there is a fridge and washing up facilities. However it does not have a shop or restaurant on site.
