The site itself had easy access for our RV, and the pitches are a good size, nice and level too. The whole site is spotlessly clean with good facilities and the staff were friendly and helpful.

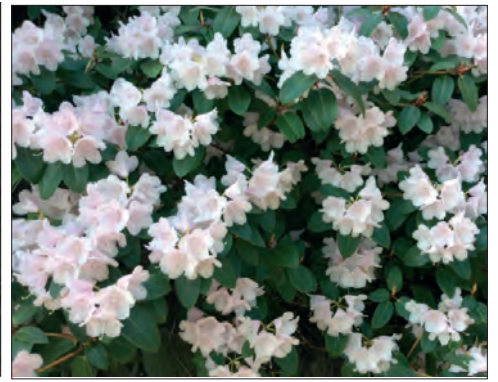
The designated dog walking area in the woodland was much enjoyed by Shadow and Cinders!

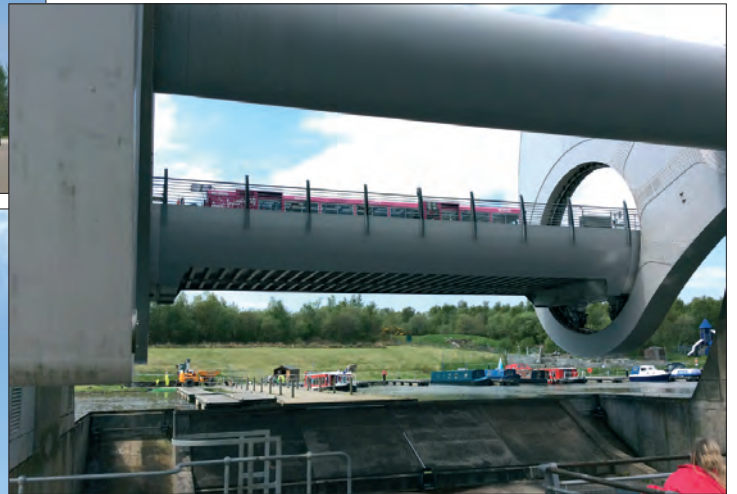
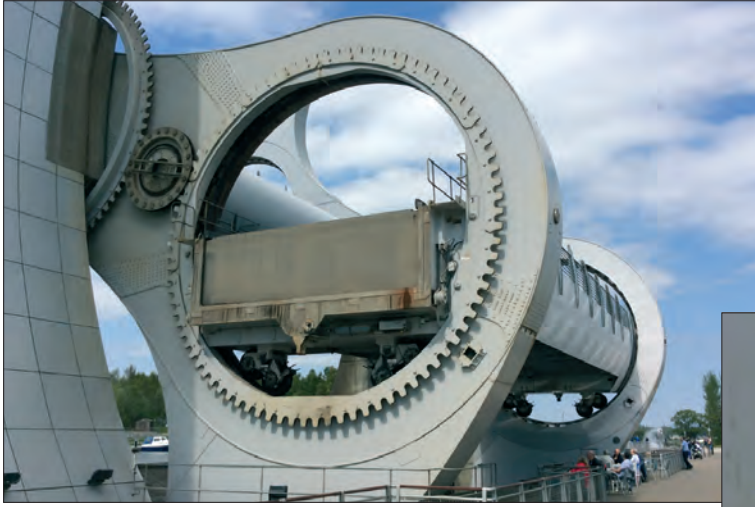




FALKIRK WHEEL

The Falkirk Wheel is the only rotating boat lift in the world and is close to Falkirk. It was opened in 2002 and links the Forth of Clyde with The Union Canal.

The only other boat lift in the UK is the Anderton vertical lift which is close Anderton in Cheshire. This lift was opened in 1875 and restored to working order between 2001 and 2002. It links The River Wearver and The Trent and Mersey Canal.



THE KELPIES

The Kelpies were just about 13 miles from Witches Craig. They stand over 100 ft high and weigh 600 tons each and they light up at night.

They pay tribute to the working horse history of central Scotland from years gone by.
