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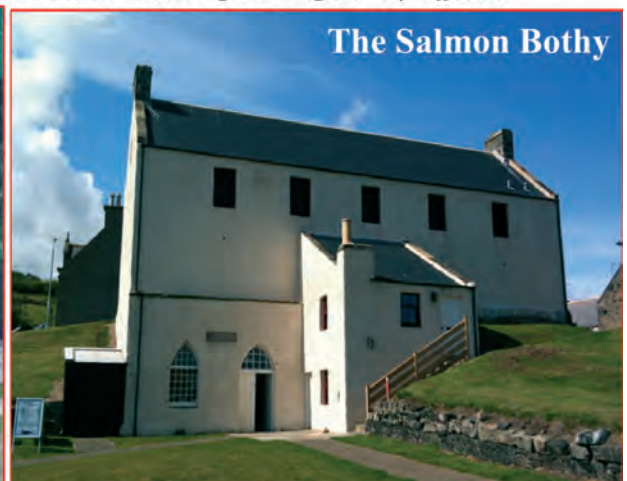
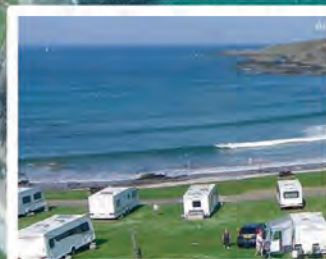
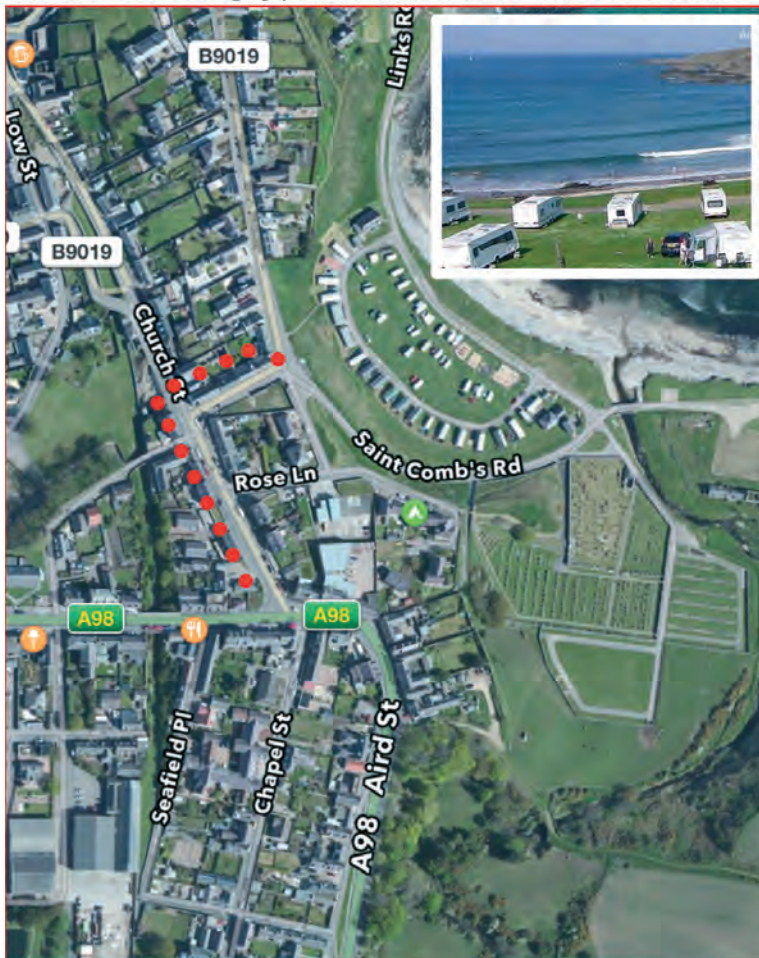

Located immediately by the shore on the glorious Banffshire Coast – Scotland's Dolphin Coast, the Portsoy Links Caravan Park offers visitors the warmest of welcomes and is within easy walking distance of the historic harbour and town with its wide range of amenities. The Park provides a splendid location for touring this very beautiful and unspoilt region and Portsoy itself is the home of the Scottish Traditional Boat Festival. We have updated our facilities and now have disabled facilities for shower / toilet. These have been done as a wet room giving easy access to everything.

A report courtesy of [www.camping.uk-directory.com](http://www.camping.uk-directory.com): Looking out across the North Sea from its 17th century harbour, the small town of Portsoy was developed principally for trade with the Baltic and the Low Countries. This included the exporting of Portsoy marble which can be found as far afield as the Palace of Versailles. The town hosts the lively Scottish Traditional Boat Festival that showcases historic wooden fishing and sailing boats (from June 17th to 29th this year. The boat festival also includes craft demonstrations, a food fayre, traditional music and road and fun runs. The town is situated on the National Cycle Route which features great rides to the south, east and west of the village and visitors can enjoy fine coastal walks in the area. The tiny fishing village of Sandend is a few miles along to the West with some fine, sandy beaches along the way. Banff and Macduff have excellent golf courses. Within an hour's drive of the village there are no less than 18 castles, from ruins to stately homes.

The park is set overlooking the bay near the harbour and village shops. The park is now operated by a subsidiary company of the Scottish Traditional Boat Festival and they believe they have one of the finest seaside locations available to visitors. The facilities on the park have been updated and now have disabled facilities. Much of the site is on sloping ground so you should take care when setting up your caravan or motor home. Their location also makes accessing a TV signal very difficult.
